PRACTICE: Bible Study

Dive into scripture and link your story to the story and wisdom of the Bible

PRACTICE: One-to-One Relational Meetings

Use One-to-Ones to create and deepen relationships within your church

2 DISCERN Our Gifts – Lay and Ordained – for Mission

PRACTICE: Asset and Gifts Mapping

Identify the gifts and talents to which you and your ministry has access

PRACTICE: Church Hall Meetings

Gather members of all ages to build community, listen for each others' gifts and passions, and cast shared vision

3 GO to Join God's Movement in the Neighborhood

PRACTICE: Research Your Demographics

Study your neighborhood and learn who is there, who is coming

PRACTICE: Neighborhood Prayer Walks

Walk the area around your church and discover who is there, where life is blooming and where God is calling you

4 LISTEN Deeply and Grow New Relationships

PRACTICE: One-to-One Relational Meetings

Use One-to-Ones to create and deepen relationships with neighbors and potential partners

5 PARTNER with Neighbors for Healing & Reconciliation

PRACTICE: Neighborhood Asset and Gift Mapping

Discover the gifts, resources and needs of your neighborhood and form partnerships

PRACTICE: Missional Vocation Discernment

Match your ministry's assets and gifts with the neighborhood's and form mutual ministries and relationships

PRACTICE: Evangelism

Seek, name and celebrate Jesus' loving presence in the stories of all people – then invite everyone to MORE

PRACTICE: Hospitality Assessment

Study your congregation from the visitors' point of view and create practices to welcome newcomers
